San Francisco 1906 Earthquake and Fire



Magnitude 7.7-7.9 Richter Scale



3-Day Fire
478-1,498 Dead
28,188 Buildings Destroyed



200,000 People Homeless



5,600 Wood Shacks Built Quickly for Refugees



11 Camps -- 16,000 people

September 1906 - October 1907



Camps Closed 1908
5,343 Shacks Sold to Refugees
Moved To Vacant Lots

Western Neighborhoods Project Restored Shack – Removed it



Volunteers Repaired Shack



Faithful Restoration


